When a group is small, compared to other groups, reliability is reduced, and caution should be used when interpreting change over time. In general, changes in the performance of a large group, such as Withitexaminees in Texes, are less likely to have occurred by chance than changes in the performance of a small group, such as American Indian or Pacific IslanderAP examinees in Texas. The reliability of between up comparisons also depends on the sizes of the groups. Wherogps differ substantially in size, comparisons of performance results between them can be misleading and, generally, are not appropriate ample, the American Indian and Pacific Islander examinee populations are small in number, compared to dethethraic examinee populations. Therefore, performance results for these groupsuld not be compared from year to year or to other racial/ethnic groups
