5. Are local educational agencies (LEAs) halized if they have more than one percent of their students participate in STAAR Alternate 2?

No. The onepercent limitation isimposed on each state not each LEAA.part of the state's commitment that all students receive access to enrolled gradevel academic curriculumstandards and that there arehigh expectations or all students, the state is responsible for ensuring LEAs understand that an alternate assessment exists fourdents who meet the criteria as students with the most significant cognitive disability and who are taught alternate academic curriculumstandards aligned with their enrolled gradevel standards Just as an ARD committee uses the students data to drive the development and implementation of laother components of the student's individualized education program (IEP), the ARD committee resviber student's data to determine the most appropriate assessment within the context of the definitions and criteria set by the state When an LEA has more than epercent of its student population participating in STAAR Alternate 2, federal requirements mandate the collection of information from LEAassuring that testing decisions were made in accordance withe laws and the state's criteria well as justification statements as to why it was necessary the LEA to exceed the percent.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

6. How does an ARD committed etermine if a student meets the participation requirements or STAAR Alternate 2?

ARDcommittees should use a variety of data sources as they walk through the participation requirements for STAAR Alternate Key sources of data include student's fulland initial individual evaluation (IEE) or reevaluation, present levels of academic achievement and functional performance (PLAAFP) nual academic and functional goals, and progress oward those goals. Other datamay include current parent and teacher observations information. The updated participation requirements allow the ARD committee atoalyze the student's data to rise the appropriate choice at each step of the form.

Additionally, the ARD committee should consider the ronological age f the student and the generalized expectations of that age growpen making determination segarding age appropriateness

7. Why do students who are identified with a Specific Learning Disability (SLD) or only a Speech Impairment (SI) no longer meet the articipation requirements for STAAR Alternate 22

The previousparticipation requirements indicated thattudents with only a high incidence disability, such as an SLD onlightly did not meet the participation requirements or STAAR Alternate 2.As stakeholders eviewed the participation requirements, it became evident that hese disabilities on their own donot meet the definition of the most significant cognitive disabilities based on the descriptions of these terms in federal and state law. To be identified with an SLD, a student's learning problems are not primarily the result of visual, hearing, or motor disabilities, an intellectual disability, are motional disturbance, can environmental, cultural, or economic disadvantageIn addition, SI is a communication disord that adversely affects a child's educational performance. These disabilities in isolation do not align with the state's definition the most significant cognitive disabilities and the criteria for participation in STAAR Alternate 2.

Similarly, an ARD committee should not determinessessmen participation based solely on other disability categorie (e.g., autism) and automatically assume the dudent should be assessed with STAAR Alternate 2.



8. Based on the phrases "ongoing adult assistance" and "need for ongoing, individual **apper**cialized supports," does a student who demonstrates some level of independence in functional tasks meet the participation requirements?

12. If an ARD committee determined STAAR Alternate participation for the 2023-2024 school yeaprior to the updated participation requirements, does the student's eligibility haveto be reviewed?

Yes. The ARD committee must review and determine student participation in state assestion eatish school year. If the ARD committee has already reviewed and determined straiged students for the 2023-2024 school gar using the previous STAAR Alternate 2 participation requiremeter should review all eligible students to determine if any STAAR Alternate 2 decisions need to be re evaluated based on the updated participation requirements.

For those students whose participation needs to be new aluated based on the updated requirements, assessment participation decisions may be made through a anter dimentiby agreement in accordance with 34 CFS 300.324(a(4)(i) or a full AR Dommittee meeting. 21. Are there any implications on graduation options forsaudent who previously participated in STAAR Alternate 2 but no longer mesthe participation requirements?

No. In accordance with 9 TAC 889.1070 an ARD committeenay determine that satisfactory performance or required EOC assessment is not necessary graduation.

22. Do students who no longer meet the participation requirements for STAAR Alternate 2 have to take STAAR EOC assessnsefor courses they have taken in the past?

No. Students are responsible for complying ith state testing requirements based on their ARD committee's decisions for that particular school year. Beginning with the 2022024 school year, students who no longer meet the participation requirements for STAAR Alternate 2 willto the STAAR EOC assessments for any courses they are einchled have corresponding EOC assessments indicated in 19 TAC §89.1070 student's ARD committee magontinue to determine that satisfactory performance on required EOC assessments not necessary or graduation.

For example, during the 2022023 school year student receiving special education services was enrolled in English I and met the participation requirements for AST Alternate 2The student complied with his state testing requirements by taking the STAAR Alternate 2 English I EOC assessment. Now, during the 2022024 school year the student is enrolled in English II and no longer meets the participation requirements for STAAR Alternate 2. The student must take the STAAR English II EOC assessment to comply with state testing requirements; ARD committee may determine that the student does not need to perform satisfactorily on the assessment graduation requirements.
