 - In an effort to accommodate LEAs in need of additional time to submit these waivers, the deadline for districts to submit their Missed School Days Waiver for SY 2019-2020 was extended to Friday, July 3.
- Supporting Student Mental Health
 - We posted a <u>video</u> with simple steps families can take to help their children during this challenging time.
 - In addition to flyers in <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u> detailing steps to take to support student mental health, <u>social media resources</u> were included for districts to distribute to their families.
